The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will hold a Public Information Open House for the State Road (S.R.) 809 / Military Trail Resurfacing Project, from 5 p.m. until 7 p.m., Wednesday, April 28, in the Haverhill Town Hall, 4585 Charlotte Street, Haverhill, Florida. Project team members will be on hand to provide interested residents and business operators with information about this project, scheduled to begin Monday, May 3, 2010.

This 1.737-mile resurfacing project goes from just north of Oxford Street to Okeechobee Boulevard / S.R. 704 in Unincorporated Palm Beach County and the Town of Haverhill. The project will last approximately eight months, weather permitting, and cost an estimated \$1.9 million. Ranger Construction Industries will be performing the work and AIM Engineering & Surveying, Inc. will oversee the project on behalf of FDOT.

Scope of Work:

- Repaving and restriping Military Trail from Oxford Street to Okeechobee Boulevard;
- Minor storm water drainage improvements;
- Replacing damaged curb and gutter, driveways and sidewalks at various locations in the project limits;
- New pedestrian curb ramps to meet current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards; and
- Upgrading street signs.

Maintenance of Traffic:

In order to minimize impacts to residents, motorists and area businesses, work will be performed in phases. However, it will be necessary to close travel lanes and sidewalks at various locations during non-peak daytime and nighttime hours to perform this work safely.

At least one lane will remain open in each direction through the work zone at all times. Pedestrian traffic will be maintained on one side of the road at all times.

This project might require closing driveways and bus stops for brief periods to accommodate construction. Project personnel will coordinate with property owners and businesses in advance of any closures and transit riders will be directed to the next closest bus stop.
